Due to the latest mitigation efforts the funeral arrangements for Dick have been changed.

No public visitation will be held on Thursday. Private visitation only.

Funeral mass will remain private.

The graveside service will still be public, however strict adherence to the Governor's Mandate will be followed. Masks will be required in the cemetery.

Dick Neumann, age 74, of Carroll, died Friday, November 13, 2020 at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

A private Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 10:30 a.m. Friday, November 20, 2020 at St. Lawrence Church-St. John Paul II Parish in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Fr. Shinoj Jose. Instrumental music will be provided by Kate Cuddy. Lectors will be Cheyann Neumann, Kaia Neumann, and Riley Coats. Honorary Casket Bearers will be Mitchell Neumann and Paxton

Neumann. Casket Bearers will be Ashley Neumann, Taylor Neumann, Devin Behrendsen, Caden Neumann, James Dirkx, John Snyder and James Bender. The public is invited to attend the burial following the funeral mass at the Carroll City Cemetery at approximately 11:15 a.m. Military Honors will be conducted by the Carroll American Legion.

Weather permitting, Dick's family will greet family and friends from 4-6 p.m. on Thursday outside of the Sharp Funeral Home in Carroll while a viewing will be held inside of the funeral home. In case of inclement weather the visitation will be moved inside the funeral home, and strict COVID-19 guidelines will be followed.

Those attending services are required to wear a face covering and abide by COVID-19 restrictions.

Born on October 15, 1946 in Ida Grove, Iowa, Dick was the son of Mary and Pat Thies. He spent his younger years in the Arthur area and graduated from Odebolt-Arthur High School with the class of 1965. Dick proudly served his country in the US Army, completing two tours of duty in Vietnam between 1965 and 1968.

On June 19, 1970, he was united in marriage to the love of his life, Camela Breon, at Sacred Heart Catholic Church in Ida Grove. Dick and Camie remained in the Odebolt area following their marriage where they raised their children. Dick and Camie later moved to the Carroll Community where they continued to make memories for their nearly 47 years of marriage. Dick

farmed many years followed by working for Bil Mar Foods in Storm Lake and later retired from Pella Corporation in Carroll. In his retirement, Dick continued his love of farming by helping out at the Dan Ackerman Farm in Sac County.

Dick loved camping, especially sitting around the campfire enjoying his Old Milwaukee late into the night. Dick never lost his roots in farming and enjoyed tinkering with his 720 John Deere tractor, which he still used from time to time to rake hay. Dick also enjoyed taking his 1939 Chevy truck that he proudly restored out for drives. Always a fan of sports, you could find Dick cheering on the Steelers, Yankees, Hawkeyes, and Cyclones. Dick was a member of St. Lawrence Church in Carroll. Dick loved his family and cared deeply about his children and grandchildren. Friends and family of Dick never doubted the undeniable love and adoration he had for his Camie and now find solace in knowing they are together again.

Survivors include his sons: Chad Neumann and his wife Ann of Carroll, Travis Neumann and his wife Sara of Carroll, daughter: Shannon Neumann of Carroll; his grandchildren: Ashley Neumann, Taylor (James) Dirkx, Devin Behrendsen, Caden Neumann, Riley Coats, Cheyann Neumann, Kaia Neumann, Mitchell Neumann, and Paxton Neumann; his brothers Wayne, Gerry, Don, and Bob as well as extended relatives and many dear friends.

Dick was preceded in death by his wife Camela in 2017, his parents Pat and Mary Thies, siblings Lois Johnson and Michael Thies, and his mother and father-in-law Tom and Dorothy Breon.

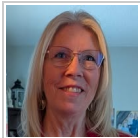

“Dick was a good friend, fabulous father and husband. I was first friends with Cammie, but you all know if you were friends with Cam being friends with Dick was included. They were inseparable. Making it through difficult times when I lived in Iowa would have been much harder without their love and support. Mostly Dick and I shared the same views on life, we loved sharing a beer together and watching football even though we didn't agree on the same brand of beer or the same team. Didn't matter, we were friends and could kid around and still love each other. I am sure many have the same types of stories. After I moved to Oregon Cam and Dick never missed calling me on my birthday, I wasn't as good some years about calling them on their exact birthday. Before cell phones Cam would be on one phone and Dick on another extension, I treasured those calls. After Cam passed in 2017 Dick and I continued the tradition, I will miss our conversations and especially his laugh. Dick was a quiet man, but that didn't mean he didn't have his opinions. Yes, he did rant sometimes when his family wasn't living life the way he thought it should be, and none were spared, but his love for his family never wavered.

I admired Dick so much when he was a small family farmer during the most difficult times for that path in life. I remember when he decided that he could no longer include pig farming, it was impossible to compete with the corporations. Farming was a tough business, and Dick sometimes had to work other jobs. He did whatever was needed to make sure his family was safe and supported, even though I know he didn't like some of the work. He loved being on the tractor and never stopped, I bet he is driving around on a tractor now and Cam is cooking him a delicious meal.

When the family visited us in Oregon on their trip out West they visited Crater Lake National Park. Dick was a tough man, but he had to stop several times driving around the rim of Crater Lake. He couldn't believe the curvy mountain road which included patches with no guard rails, made him really nervous. For years afterwards he told me never again, he thought for sure he was going to fall over

the side to the lake below. We who love our mountains thought that was pretty funny. I think he would have enjoyed camping in our woods though, as long as the bears kept their distance.

My condolences to Chad, Travis, Shannon, and all of his grandchildren. He loved you all very much. He will also be missed by many friends that he shared good times with and supported with kind words and advice when needed.
