Douglas King, 63, of rural Coon Rapids, passed away on Wednesday, August 6, 2025, at his home near Coon Rapids. next several years, he lived and farmed with his family.

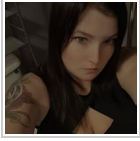

When he would leave the farm, you could find him at farm sales and the sale barn. Being a "numbers guy", Doug always worked "a deal" and was excited and proud to tell about the deal he made. Doug was smart, honest, and extremely hard-working. He was a kind, caring, and giving man. He always found the best in everyone, he trusted and believed in people, and provided opportunities for them to have a "chance". Doug will be missed by so many, but one thing he has always made sure of is "it'll be alright".

Doug is survived by his wife Cheryl of Coon Rapids; two brothers Denny (Jerrine) King and Randy (Shelly) King, all of Coon Rapids; a sister Janice (Kenny) Knobbe of Auburn; and by several in-laws, aunts, uncles, nieces, nephews and cousins.

He was preceded in death by his parents, a brother Ronnie King, twin sisters Judy King (at 6 months old) and Jody King (at age 28), his grandparents: Eugene and Hattie King & Edward and Katherin Irlbeck and Cheryl's parents Roland and Marian (Loew) Daniel.
