agricultural & vehicle products, produce, farmland, etc. He often undertook projects that many thought were too difficult and through persistence would complete them as he promised. His special ability to do quick mental math aided him greatly during his life. In his later years Harold especially enjoyed operating his bulldozer to clear land to convert it to farmland, working alongside several of his children.

Harold was a hardworking, God loving man. He was a committed husband and father. He was always eager to help a neighbor, friend or even a stranger in need. His sense of humor and laughter were appreciated by all. Harold had a gift to be able to speak to anyone while sharing his faith. His favorite phone greeting was "Praise the Lord" and he always wanted people to know "Jesus loves you". Perhaps the most important and lasting impact he had on the world was his generosity of time, treasure and talent while spreading the Good News of the Lord.
