Merlin J. "Mike" Bruning, age 85 of Carroll, died Wednesday, March 30, 2011 at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

Born on March 24, 1926 at Breda, Iowa, Merlin J. Bruning was the son of

Bernard and Rose (Brune) Bruning. He spent his younger years in the Breda community and attended St. Bernard School. In 1944 Mike enlisted in the United States Army where he began his decorated career that spanned over 22 years. On August 2, 1951 he married Patricia Mae Rogers at Rossville, Georgia. Throughout his career in the Army, Mike served in WWII, Korean, and Vietnam Wars. In 1966, Mike retired as a 1st Sergeant E-8, with over thirty medals, awards, and accommodations. He also received a GED Diploma from the University of Wisconsin and his pilot license while in the service. Upon retirement from his military service Mike had several jobs which included: manager of the Ames and Boone terminals for Crouse Cartidge Allied Agent, District Manager for National Trailer and Morgan Driveway, and manager of Transceiver as Vice President of Transceivers Northwest. In his formal retirement Mike traveled throughout the United States with his wife Patricia delivering motor homes for Winnebago Industries. Mike was instrumental in the fundraising and the construction of the Veteran's Memorial in Veteran's Park in Carroll. He enjoyed golfing, traveling, spending time with his family and being active in the many clubs and organizations he was a part of. Mike was a member of the RPM Club, Life Member of NRA, Carroll Moose Lodge, Carroll VFW, Carroll American Legion, and Holy Spirit Parish. Survivors include his children: Sharon (Wayne) Bellinghausen of Carroll, Michael (Laurie Prichard) Bruning of Carroll; three grandchildren; 8 great-grandchildren; his sister, Ione Beyer of Carroll; his brother, Larry (Joan) Bruning of Carroll; and sister in-law, Wilma Bruning of Carroll, as well as other relatives and numerous friends.

He was preceded in death by his parents; wife Patricia Mae in May 2002; brothers, Aaron and Ray Bruning; his sister, Alma Debourgh; and brothers and sisters in-law: George Beyer, Russ Debourgh, Augustine Underberg, and Frances Bruning.
