Ron Leiting, 84 of Carroll, and formerly of Westside, died Tuesday, December 29, 2020 at his residence in Carroll surrounded by his family.

Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 11 a.m., Saturday, January 2, 2021 at St. John Catholic Church in Arcadia. The Celebrant will be Fr. Timothy Pick. Music will be by Sharon Bierl. Born on May 19, 1936 in Carroll, Iowa, Ron was the son of Ben and Caroline (Sanders) Leiting. He graduated Valedictorian of the Class of 1954 from

Arcadia High School. He worked hand-in-hand with his father and brothers on their farms as a grain and livestock farmer. On February 8, 1958, he was united in marriage to Shirley Winker at St. John's Catholic Church in Arcadia. They raised their family on their farm south of Westside. He enjoyed taking his family for yearly summer vacations to various places, including The Rockies, Yellowstone National Park, the Grand Canyon, and Canada, his favorite being Colorado. He enjoyed spending time on his front porch observing the beauty of the land, the changing seasons, and the deer, raccoon, squirrels, woodchucks, and birds. He served as Washington Township trustee for many years. Ron was an active member of St. John's Parish in Arcadia. In 2016, he and his wife moved to Carroll to the home of their son Dan, where they received the finest of care. He passed away peacefully in that home surrounded by loved ones on the evening of December 29.
