Ruth Vanderheiden, age 81, of Carroll, died Friday, November 21, 2014 at her residence surrounded by her family.

Mass of the Christian Burial will be celebrated at 11 a.m. Tuesday, November 25, 2014 at Holy Spirit Catholic Church in Carroll. The Celebrant will be Fr. Timothy Johnson. Mass Servers will be Dawson Miller and Patrick McAlister. Music will be by Barb McDermott, Holy Spirit Choir with Thomas Geake as soloist. Lector for the funeral mass will be Linda Berger. Friends may call at the Sharp Funeral Home in Carroll after 4 p.m. on Monday where there will be a rosary at 5 p.m. by the Carroll Catholic Daughters of the Americas and a Christian Wake Service at 7 p.m. by Holy Spirit Parish.

The casket will be moved to Holy Spirit Church at 10 a.m. on Tuesday where visitation will resume until time of the funeral mass.

Ruth was born on September 12, 1933 at Manning, Iowa the daughter of John and Clara (Lechtenberg) Sextro. She spent her younger years in the Manning area attending country school and later graduated from Manning High School in 1953.

Ruth was employed at General Electric in Carroll from 1973 until its closing in 1998. She was also active with the Catholic Daughters of America, St. Anthony Hospital Auxiliary, New Hope Village, Holy Spirit Rug Makers, and assisted with Bingo at St. Anthony Nursing Home in Carroll.

Ruth belonged to four card clubs and also enjoyed cross stitching, gambling, puzzles, watching television, Iowa State Basketball and going to the Rec. Center in Carroll. 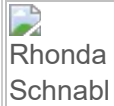
