Thelma Wernimont, 99 of Carroll, died Sunday, January 7, 2024, at St. Anthony Regional Hospital in Carroll.

She assisted her family on the farm and also babysat for several families in the area. On November 18, 1952, Thelma was united in marriage to Leo Wernimont at Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church. The couple made their home southeast of Mt. Carmel where she was a devoted homemaker and enjoyed tending to her garden, their apple orchard, flowers, and quilting. Thelma was a lifelong member of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Church.
