Winona "Nonie" Grote, age 85, of Carroll, died Friday afternoon, November 27, 2015 at St. Anthony Nursing Home in Carroll, with her family at her side.

Born on April 18, 1930 at Scranton, Iowa, Winona Mae was the daughter of Clifford and Gladys (Taute) McCollum. She grew up in Greene County, and graduated from Bayard High School in 1948. After high school she attended A.I.B. College.

On August 21, 1951 Winona was united in marriage to Vernon Grote at St. Bernard's Catholic Church in Breda. The couple lived southwest of Breda where Nonie was a devoted homemaker. In 1953 the couple moved to the Carroll community. She also worked at Ocoma Foods in Carroll, and at General Electric in Carroll from there she later retired.

Nonie enjoyed bowling, quilting, needlework, baking, cooking, canning, and while camping, shelling walnuts. She also enjoyed her card clubs, sports, especially the Iowa Hawkeyes, and wintering with her husband Vernon in Arizona. Nonie enjoyed collecting Porcelain Dolls. Most of all Nonie enjoyed the time she spent with her family. She was a member of St. Lawrence Parish in Carroll.
